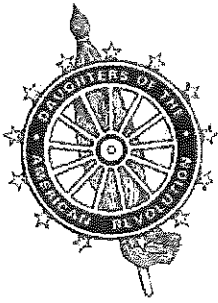

## Jean Rutherford Wengler Memorial Scholarship

All information should be typed and submitted on 8 1/2" X 11" white paper. Use only one side of the paper and number the pages. All applications must be postmarked by March 31, 2017. The scholarship is awarded without regard to gender, race, religion, national origin or disability.

### Complete the following:

1. List all your participation in high school activities.
2. Describe your plans for college and the expectations for your career in the future.
3. List your extracurricular activities such as: clubs, hobbies, work, church, scouting, etc.
4. Complete the essay below.

**Include an official transcript** provided by your school. It should be complete through the first semester of 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Include two letters of recommendation** from individuals familiar with you and your abilities such as: a scout leader. Clergy, employer. faculty member, etc. Each letter should include the writer's identity, contact phone number and association with you. The writer should state the reasons which qualify you as deserving of this scholarship.

Note: Do not include letters from family members.

**Essay:** We have recently witnessed a hotly contested election for President of the United States. Our Founding Fathers established the process of the electoral college to be a compromise between election of the President by the vote of Congress and the popular vote of the people. They made it part of the United States Constitution believing that it would be both a buffer and provide fair power to all states regardless of size.

However, in today's society, many believe that a popular vote is a more accurate measure of the people's voice. Please choose one side of this debate and defend your position in no more than 500 words.
